

Connecticut River 410 miles

- MOUTH **Old Saybrook**: Located at the mouth of the Connecticut River, this town offers a mix of residential, historical, and boating areas.
- ON RIVER **Essex**: A historic village with strong maritime roots, featuring a marina on the Connecticut River.
- ON RIVER **Hartford** city on river
- ON RIVER **Chester**: A small town known for its marina and location along the river.
- RIVERS: Farmington River merges into Connecticut River at **Windsor**

Housatonic River 149 miles

- MOUTH **Milford – Stratford** mouth of the river
- ON RIVER **Derby, Shelton** along river
- ON RIVER **Groton**: Located across from New London, this town features substantial naval and shipbuilding industry.

Thames River 104 miles

- ON MOUTH **New London**: A historic, deep-water port situated on the Thames River, serving as a hub for both commercial, military (submarines), and ferry, including the Block Island and Montauk ferries.
- RIVERS: Quinebaug River (69 miles) → Shetucket (20 miles) → Thames River (15 miles)

Quinnipiac River 46 miles

- ON MOUTH **New Haven**: Located at the mouth of the Quinnipiac River, New Haven harbor is the busiest commercial shipping port between New York and Boston.

Norwalk River 22 miles

- ON MOUTH **Norwalk**: A coastal city with a strong maritime, industrial, and residential, and recreational history.

Mill River 17 miles

- ON WHITE **Stamford**: A city that has developed around its harbor.

Pequonnock River 16 miles

- ON MOUTH **Bridgeport**: Known as the "Park City" this city has a deep, dredged channel in the Pequonnock River, acting as a major commercial port on the Long Island Sound.

Mystic River 3 miles

- ON MOUTH **Mystic**: Famous for the Mystic Seaport Museum at Long Island Sound, it is a historic shipbuilding, fishing, and boating center.
